THE REQUIREMENTS:

1. **Celebrate** the first Sunday after Easter
2. Sincerely **Repent** of all our sins
3. Place our complete **Trust** in Jesus
4. **Venerate** the image of The Divine Mercy
5. **Holy Communion** while in a state of grace
6. **Confession** can be before Divine Mercy Sunday
7. **Be Merciful** to others, through actions, words and prayers on their behalf

THE PROMISE:

Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on Divine Mercy Sunday will be granted an indulgence, which means complete forgiveness of both Sin and Punishment!

Even if you didn't sign-up for a time slot, know you are welcome to come and go as you please – just as long as there is another person in church with Jesus.

Imagine that you accidentally put a ball through a neighbor's window. You apologize and beg for forgiveness and he does forgive you. But there is still a broken window. Out of justice you need to replace it somehow. That is what temporal punishment is like. It isn't out of vengeance that your neighbor asks you to pay for the glass, rather a demand for justice. There is a window, a balance, that needs to be restored. When a soul dies with unforgiven venial sins or with temporal punishment which still needs to be paid; they have to make amends for those sins. That is what purgatory is about. For every soul, before it enters into heaven, must be purified. On Divine Mercy Sunday, God is not only forgiving your sins, but Jesus is paying your debt! Paid in full!
